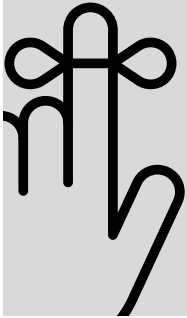


# Working Together Towards a Cleaner Neighborhood

Owners, tenants, Midtown, and the Baltimore City Government all have a role to play in keeping our streets, sidewalks, and alleys (*yes, even our alleys*) clean, inviting, rat-and-odor free.

## Tenant Responsibilities



- Keep trash lids on **tight**.
- Keep trash and recycling cans off the sidewalk or alley **except on collection day**.
- Remember, if it attracts rats, it's trash, and not recycling! *Pizza boxes, take-out, etc., should always go in trash.*
- **Let landlords know** if your trash or recycling cans are **consistently full**.

*Baltimore City Code, Art. 23, § 4-1*

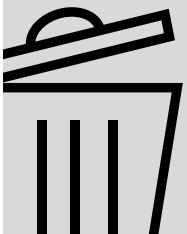
## Property Owner/Management Responsibilities



- **Keep property grounds maintained** on multi-unit properties, including: mowing grass, keeping tree wells weeded and gardens tended to.
- **Provide enough trash and recycling cans** for clean, rat-free trash removal.

Trash Day: M T W TH F

Recycling Day  
is every other: M T W TH F

## Use the **311 App** for help with these common problems

### Illegal Dumping

- Repetitive dumping of large amounts of trash or building materials

### Household Trash in Public Right of Way

- Improper use/lack of use receptacle

### High Grass or Weeds

- Reporting high grass in tree well or on private property

### Bulk Trash

- For items that Midtown is excluded from collecting.

### Fallen Trees or Tree Pruning

- When Midtown is unable to collect due to equipment capacity or limitation of reach

### Rats

- To request rat abatement
